At one-point last year we were the fastest growing district in the entire country. That is really something. We welcomed 4 new clubs into the Lions in our district, another incredible feat. I am looking to continue the success that we've had over the past year and really bolster our ranks and get that membership up as well as the services and activities that Lions do. I would also like clubs to take pictures of their events and send them to Bruce and me so we can put together a video of 11D2 in action. I want clubs to be on the lookout for possible specialty clubs that are looking to become nonprofits. It could be a bike club, motorcycle club or even a stamp collecting club.....there are potential members everywhere, and we just have find them. I want thank PDG Sami for all he has given our district over the past year and a great stepping stone for all future governors to follow. There are so many "behind the scenes" people that also were a big part of last year and none was bigger than Lion Dave Eberlien, who had trained the last 18 11D2 governors and who passed away suddenly earlier this year. Since July 1, 2021, 11-D2's opening balance off active members was 1,314; an increase of nine. This is a good start to the year for us and we certainly want to continue the momentum in the coming months. Because of this, it's important for clubs to mentor their new members. The objective is to help every new member achieve the goal of better serving his or her community. It does so through a program of personal development that helps members realize the potential that their unique

skills and knowledge offer. The club mentoring also prepares new members for leadership in clubs, in the association, and in their personal lives as well. For 11-D2, this means more hands and better service for the people who need it most.

A mentoring program is completed in two parts, "Basic" and "Advanced". Each part is completed in two levels and is summarized below.

## Basic Mentoring Program

The goals of the Basic Mentoring Program are to gain responsibility and to build relationships. The Basic Mentoring Program can be considered a stepping stone to a leadership role.

- **Level 1 = The Responsibility of Being a Lion:** The first level of the Basic Mentoring Program is devoted to developing an understanding of who Lions are, their vision of humanitarian service, the traditions, the organizational structure, and the responsibility of being a Lions club member. It should be a goal of every club that all new Lions complete Level 1 in their first three months of membership.
- **Level 2 = Relationships:** The second level of the Basic Mentoring Program is for developing relationships and organizational skills in preparation for leadership at the club level. Level 2 should be completed in the new Lion's first six months of membership.

## Advanced Mentoring Program

- **Level 1 = Results:** The emphasis of this level is upon developing accountability for results by focusing on community projects and programs that provide useful and needed humanitarian service. Completion of this level provides a stepping-stone for accepting a leadership role within the club.
- **Level 2 = Replication:** This level concentrates on the mentee's role in developing others for leadership in the association and for humanitarian service. It ensures long-range growth and can serve as a basis for leadership within the district structure. This phase can be augmented with additional training at the district level and at area forums.
