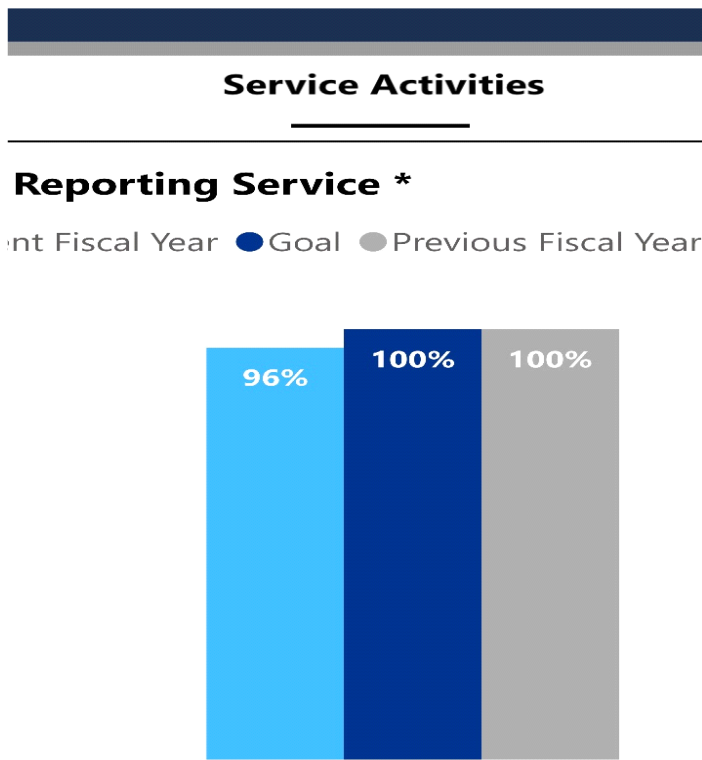
LCIF’s Refugees and Displaced Persons fund helps ensure that Lions are there to help those in need find safety and security.




