club is helping your community during this crisis. By posting information, updates, and safety tips, you can start a conversation online and transform your club's social media network into a communications hub for your community.

### **Fight Hunger**

It's important to make sure that we do our part to meet the needs of our communities. And fighting food insecurity is a great way to provide comfort to those in need without having to leave your home. Your club can support its local food bank or homeless shelter through fundraising or even by ordering a care package of other essentials like toilet paper, toothpaste, and clothing.

### **Give the Gift of Safety**

As you serve during this crisis, your personal safety is the most important thing to remember. And due to a shortage of cleaning supplies and personal protective equipment, such as masks and gloves, this is becoming even more challenging. While many Lions have come together to form mask-making groups and have generously shared their cleaning supplies, it's essential that you make sure to take care of yourself.

### **Find a Partner in Service**

Our communities are full of experienced professionals and organizations that are also doing their part. And many of them need help. Here are key points for donations to Midwest Tornadoes:

- **All donations are MJF credit eligible and applied to Campaign 100 for personal or club goals.**
- **General Disaster is a restricted fund so although donations receive MJF credits, they are not eligible for District Club Community Grants.**
- **Make a credit card donation at this link: <https://www.lionsclubs.org/en/donate> check the General Disaster option, then e-mail a copy of the receipt to [donorassistance@lionsclubs.org](mailto:donorassistance@lionsclubs.org) and indicate for Midwest Tornadoes.**
- **To make a donation by check – Make checks payable to LCIF, indicate General Disaster/Midwest Tornadoes in the memo field. Mail to: LCIF, Department 4547, Carol Stream, IL 60122-4547.**
- **Be sure to include donor information and an allocation by donor list, if individual donors are expecting to receive donation and MJF credits for their donations, but the club is consolidating the funds into one overall check.**
- **Note processing time for new donations will be a bit slower due to the upcoming holiday and office closures.**

Hearing aids are something this Lions club is working on providing more of to those with hearing issues.

The club is also a supporter of Leader Dogs for the Blind, organization that raises dogs to be guide dogs. Swartz said some past members had raised puppies who were later trained to be guide dogs. This Lions Club also supports other organizations and sponsors other events in the Harbor Beach area. They include:

- Sponsoring the Harbor Beach Cart Derby
- Supporting the Boy Scouts
- Sending packages to military service members
- Supporting Harbor Beach Community Connections
- Supporting a diabetic alert dog program
- Sponsoring Harbor Beach little league baseball.
- Supporting special needs kids at the Huron Community Fair
- Supporting Harbor Beach Goodfellows

- Providing two \$500 scholarships for Harbor Beach High School graduates each year
- Sponsoring Port Hope's fireworks shows
- Supporting Relay for Life
- Helping maintain the three Welcome to Harbor Beach signs

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, there were some events the club puts on that were not held, like their annual Easter egg hunt where kids and adults could get their eyesight tested. The club also had to cancel its Thanksgiving dinner where they serve over 300 dinners either

The club bought a former Free Methodist Church in April of 2020. This was after the regular meeting place burnt down, had to resort to random places to meet. This is now their permanent meeting place.

Marysville Lions Club members continue to serve in their community at Mid-City Nutrition Saturday morning. 1<sup>st</sup>. Vice District Governor Dr. Shawn Whitman works with several other Marysville Lions serving their community, literally. They prepare the dinners to hand out. ## ELKTON LIONS CLUB KEEPS ON SERVING

The Elkton Lions Club recently reached a milestone in service to its community: The service organization held its 200th popup food pantry since the pandemic began almost two years ago. The first free distribution was held in March 2020, just a few weeks after the lockdown began and many Upper Thumb residents found themselves out of work. The Elkton Lions wanted to do something to help, and members teamed with the Food Bank of Eastern Michigan to organize some free food distributions.

**Update:** Just got off the phone with my representative from the Food Bank of Eastern Michigan. First of March we go back to paying for each semi regardless of day, \$1,200 per semi. Any person or group that would like to fund a semi may also pick the location we have them. This is a 53-foot semi-trailer filled with anywhere approx. 15,000 to 25,000 pounds of groceries. The funds simply cover the shipping cost, you can imagine what 20,000 pounds of groceries would cost. Please contact me, KURT DAMROW, 989-975-1503, or message on Facebook for those in Huron County, Tuscola, even North Sanilac, if anybody is interested. I'll come out and look at your location to make sure we can safely help at that location. I'll do the paperwork. Hand out...and clean up help, will require you to provide around 15 volunteers for that day of the event.

With this in mind, the goal is to have 4 Free Pop Ups per month, but that's only based on our ability to get donations. We have a 501c3 if needed. Thank You All as we've been doing this since March 28th, 2020, 200 free food pantries completed as of last Friday in Akron, MI. Lion Kurt Damrow
