SLEEP IN HEAVENLY PEACE

Many of the Lions Clubs are involved in this endeavor and if your club is looking for something to do this organization is looking for financial and volunteer help. Estimates of 3% of any population of school-age children sleep on the floor because they do not have beds. SHP fundraises and builds beds for these kids. Each bed is around \$250 and includes the bed, mattress, and bedding. We need help fundraising, holding bedding drives, and actual handson work to build these beds. SHP is always looking for motivated individuals to help spread the words, "No kid sleeps on the floor in our town." As of right now, there are chapters in Wayne, Flushing, and a new one in Lapeer that is just starting out. Bed builds for the Lapeer Chapter will begin in the Spring and hopefully, we can be putting out over 40 beds per year for our children as it grows.

All children deserve a safe, comfortable place to lay their heads. In Idaho and across the US, too many boys and girls go without a bed—or even a pillow—to sleep on. These children end up sleeping on couches, blankets, and even floors. This can affect their happiness and health.

That's where Sleep in Heavenly Peace comes in. We're a group of volunteers dedicated to building, assembling, and delivering top-notch bunk beds to children and families in need. Our organization has grown steadily over time, and we're working on opening more chapters in different states to serve more people.

So many great charities provide clothing, meals, and toys to families in need. But as wonderful as this aid is, few organizations offer suitable beds and bedding to the kids in these families.

At SHP, we fully believe that a bed is a basic need for the proper physical, emotional, and mental support that a child needs. When it was brought to our attention that the need for beds went far beyond our own neighborhoods, we stepped up and took the initiative. We're a national organization answering the call to a national problem.

If a child needs a bed, we want to make sure they get one.

READING ACTION PROGRAM

Emphasizing reading

Education and literacy are key to overcoming poverty, disease and other social issues. Yet to-day, nearly one billion people worldwide are illiterate. Literacy is the essential foundation for participation in our global society. Without literacy, the world cannot fight poverty and disease, reduce child mortality, achieve gender equality and ensure sustainable development, peace and democracy. Yet, nearly 800 million people across the globe lack the ability to read and write. Of all the illiterate people in the world today, two-thirds are female and over 90 percent live in

developing countries. New access to digital information has the power to change lives and make communities stronger, but according to the Gates Foundation, nearly 5 billion people almost 90% of the world's population do not have Internet access. Lions everywhere are changing the lives of children and adults who have little or no access to schools, libraries, educational articals and the Internet. Whether they are involved with tutoring programs, book donations, or helping to build classrooms, Lions share a common goal: expanding our impact. The Lions Reading Action Program Challenges Lions to make an even greater impact. There are a few clubs in 11D2 that participate in the Reading Action Program. The Marlette Lions Club donated books to refill the little library boxes that are in town. They also donated books the EVA's place. This is where battered females and children go. The books donated here will put a smile on the faces. The USA Lions Club goes to their area school weekly to read to the children The Frieburg St. Ignatius Lions Club presented each teacher at Ubly Elementary School with \$100 to use in their classrooms for whatever they needed. PROTOCOL

The visit of the District Governor is one of the highlights of the Lions year. Certain rules of protocol apply for the official visit. This is not a campaign visit. Introduction of the Governor should be done only once – when being presented to the assembly for remarks.

It would be suggested that thirty (30) minutes be allowed for remarks by the Governor. Other Cabinet members will speak only with permission of the District Governor. The Governor is the only speaker scheduled for the meeting. The District Governor will speak and introduce the accompanying Cabinet members.

This is your opportunity to learn the vision and goals of our International President and District. Do not expect the Governor to compete with another speaker or with long, drawn-out business or board meetings. Rules are suspended and all reports are tabled

until the next Club regular meeting.

The Governor maintains a very busy schedule during the year and courtesy would suggest that the Governor scheduled visitations are honored and not changed at the last minute.

The Governor can be introduced by the club president or one of the cabinet officers present. This should be done with dignity and include information concerning the Governor's home club, business, offices held, Lion activities and family, if appropriate.

Please create an agenda to work from and start the meeting on time. Make sure all of the details are done in advance, greeters to be present, bell and banner displayed, region or zone chairmen invited, meal planned and, if a gift is being presented, make

sure it is available at the meeting.

Notify the Governor, in writing, of all special club events and extend an invitation to attend. If the Governor is expected to be a participant in the event, provide advance notification, in writing, as to the level of participation requested by the club.

When the District Governor is recognized at any Lions meeting, club or district level, all Lions should rise and remain standing until the Governor signals them to be seated Not only is this proper protocol, it is recognition of the office. If a club wishes the Governor to induct new members during the course of an official visit, again notify of the induction in advance and provide a list of names of new members, and their sponsors. Make sure new member kits are ready for presentation.




UBLY LIONS CLUB
