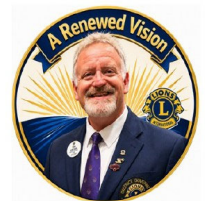

GLT PDG DON SPINKS

Training is essential for Lions Club officers to effectively lead and manage their clubs. It equips them with the necessary skills and knowledge to fulfill their responsibilities, ensuring that they can make a positive impact in their communities.

Key Reasons for Training

- **Understanding Responsibilities:** Training helps officers comprehend their roles and the expectations associated with them, which is crucial for effective leadership.
- **Skill Development:** Officers gain valuable skills in areas such as communication, organization, and project management, which are vital for running successful club activities.
- **Community Impact:** Well-trained officers can better address community needs and implement initiatives that truly make a difference.
- **Networking Opportunities:** Training sessions often provide opportunities to connect with other leaders, fostering collaboration and sharing of best practices Club Officer Training Online Access the Lions Learning Center (LLC) to complete the following recommended courses: (Accessing the LLC).
- **Club Officer Training:** This module delivers an introductory overview of club officer roles and responsibilities and club structure
- **Club President Responsibilities:** This module provides basic information and resources necessary to prepare for the club president position
- **Club Secretary Responsibilities:** This module summarizes responsibilities, explains time lines and provides information and resources necessary to prepare for the club secretary position
- **Club Treasurer Responsibilities:** This module provides basic information and resources necessary to prepare for the position of club treasurer
- In addition, sharpen your leadership skills in areas such as Goal Setting, Meeting Management, Conflict Resolution, and Effective Listening. Browse the LLC content library for these and other courses

I will be conducting club Officer training in each zone this year for all club officers and anyone else who may be interested.

GLT REPORT: PDG DON SPINKS

Lions Club leadership training programs are structured to cultivate effective leaders within the organization. These initiatives address various leadership levels and equip Lions and Leos with vital skills.

Types of Training Programs are Emerging Lions Leadership Institute (ELLI): This program is dedicated to preparing Lions for leadership roles at the club level. Candidates are generally those who have participated in a club committee but have not yet held the position of club president.

Regional Lions Leadership Institute (RLLI): This customizable training is designed to prepare Lions for leadership roles across the association. Lions University: This institution provides a thorough curriculum where participants engage in both required and elective courses, alongside leadership experiences.

Resources Available Training materials, presentations, and tutorials are accessible in the Lions Clubs International resource center. There are also specific training sessions available for club presidents and vice presidents, which include online course materials.

The Emerging Lions Leadership Institute (ELLI) equips Lions and Leos for leadership roles at the club level. Eligible candidates have successfully served on a club committee and have not yet achieved the title of Lions club president. Club first vice presidents are highly encouraged to participate.

The Regional Lions Leadership Institute (RLLI) prepares Lions and Leos for leadership roles throughout the association. This institute, organized and conducted by Lions at the local level, offers a core curriculum with elective sessions, allowing the training to be customized to address the leadership development needs of each area. Qualified candidates are prepared to seek leadership positions at the club, zone, district, and multiple district levels.

The annual Lions University Forum serves as an excellent opportunity for club officers to enhance their leadership skills. This yearly forum consists of three phases: bachelor's, master's, and PhD degrees. Completing the necessary criteria for each course and attending the annual Lions University will help you advance your leadership journey.

11D2 GLT Chair also has leadership training courses available for all club officers along with newcomer orientation with a heavy emphasis on club secretary training.

READING ACTION PROGRAM PDG DON SPINKS

Lions Clubs International Reading Action Program (RAP) aims to enhance literacy globally. This initiative encourages Lions clubs to engage in various literacy-related activities, including:

Volunteer Activities

- Serving as readers in schools and community centers.
- Supporting Braille literacy initiatives.
- Organizing book drives to collect and distribute books.
- Assisting in building classrooms and libraries.

Program Goals To improve literacy rates in communities worldwide. To foster a love for reading among children and adults alike. Sixty-six percent of students who cannot read proficiently by the end of 4th grade will end up in jail or on welfare.

FACT: Twenty-five percent of children in America grow up without learning how to read.
FACT: Nearly Eighty-five percent of the juveniles who face trial in the juvenile court system are functionally illiterate, proving that there is a close relationship between illiteracy and crime. More than 60% of all inmates are functionally illiterate In 2012, International President Wayne Madden began the Lions Reading Action Program to improve literacy around the world. In 2013, under the guidance of International President Barry Palmer, it was decided to extend the Lions RAP for an additional 10 years. Every Lions club is encouraged to have an active Reading Action Program in their communities. how can we do this?

A good start is to download the RAP Planning Guide from the LCI website, lionsclubs.org. Simply type RAP in the search box to find the document. It takes you through a process to direct your efforts. Some ideas for projects include developing a pre-school reading program, perhaps working with your local library. Another is to supply backpacks and school supplies to children in need. For the visually impaired, we can supply Braille books, or books on tape.

We can also tutor adults in reading, math, or science. In the near future, include books in your Thanksgiving and Christmas food baskets you distribute. (61% of low income families have no books at home to read.) The possibilities are limitless. Please continue the Reading Action Program in each and every Lions club.
