LIONS OF MICHIGAN FOUNDATION

The *Lions of Michigan Foundation* is a public charity that was created in 1984 to help Michigan Lions Clubs provide community services. Recently (November) our District applied for and was granted two requests that we had submitted for assistance. The Deckerville Lions requested aid for a Family that had a house fire. Their grant was approved for \$1,000. The Lapeer Lions requested aid for a youth needing vision therapy. Their grant was approved for \$2,000. THANK YOU to the Foundation. Please support this fine organization with your club, or individual donation.

The Lions of Michigan Foundation provides financial assistance and services to help uninsured and financially struggling Michigan residents with the treatment of vision problems, eye conditions and eye diseases.

Our Michigan KidSight Program is designed to identify treatable and preventable causes of vision loss in children as young as 1 year-old. We utilize a hi-tech mobile vision screener that is programmed to quickly and accurately identify vision disorders such as myopia (nearsightedness), hyperopia (farsightedness), anisometropia (unequal refraction power), astigmatism (optical defect), anisocoria (unequal pupil size) and strabismus (gaze deviations) through non-invasive testing. Our portable vision screener performs a binocular test of both eyes within 1 second, and it instantly and accurately (98% accuracy rating) identifies potential vision problems. When problems are detected, our vision screener reports a "Fail" or "Refer" status, and a detailed report identifying potential problems is provided to the child's parent or guardian for further follow-up with an optometrist or ophthalmologist.

If diagnosed early, 95% of vision disorders can be corrected, however when vision problems are not detected early, vision loss can be irreversible. Over time, treatment options diminish, and the cost of treatment increases.

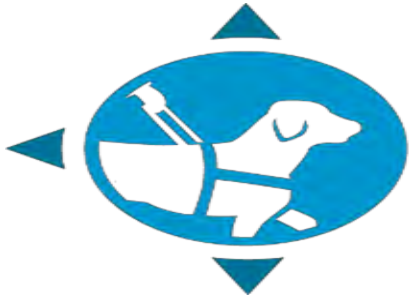

What are reading disorders?

Here is an excellent article on Dyslexia.

Reading disorders occur when a person has trouble reading words or understanding what they read. Dyslexia is one type of reading disorder. It generally refers to difficulties reading individual words and can lead to problems understanding text.

Most reading disorders result from specific differences in the way the brain processes written words and text.¹ Usually, these differences are present from a young age. But a person can develop a reading problem from an injury to the brain at any age.

People with reading disorders often have problems recognizing words they already know and understanding text they read. They also may be poor spellers. Not everyone with a reading disorder has every symptom.

Reading disorders are not a type of [intellectual or developmental disorder](#), and they are not a sign of [lower intelligence](#) or unwillingness to learn.

People with reading disorders may have other learning disabilities, too, including problems with [writing](#) or [numbers](#). Visit our topic on [learning disabilities](#) for more information about these problems.

Types of Reading Disorders

Dyslexia is the most well-known reading disorder. It specifically impairs a person's ability to read. Individuals with dyslexia have normal intelligence, but they read at levels significantly lower than expected. Although the disorder varies from person to person, there are common characteristics: People with dyslexia often have a hard time sounding out words, understanding written words, and naming objects quickly.¹ Most reading problems are present from the time a child learns to read. But some people lose the ability to read after a [stroke](#) or an [injury to the area of the brain involved with reading](#).² This kind of reading disorder is called alexia.

Hyperlexia is a disorder where people have advanced reading skills but may have problems understanding what is read or spoken aloud. They may also have cognitive or social problems. Other people may have normal reading skills but have problems understanding written words.

Memphis Lion's LEO's are a strong group of twenty- one students ranging in grades 7th- 12th. LEO's are active in many school clubs and sports but also find the time to serve their community and become leaders at the Elementary School.

Each year Leo's help with the annual food drive, sorting and packing food baskets for Holiday delivery. On delivery day LEO's help load the food into cars where Lion's Club members volunteer to deliver the baskets.

This year the Memphis LEO's hosted a Dinner and Bingo Holiday meal for seniors in the community. 86 seniors were served a salad, chicken dinner and dessert before joining in the fun of playing Bingo called by LEO's where they could win prizes or a poinsettia to take home at no cost to the seniors. The school choir, of which many LEO's were also part of, gave a concert of Christmas songs for all to enjoy.

Next, LEO's will be planning a Valentine's Day dance for fifth and six grade students at the Elementary school. Helping them to learn dances, treat them to snacks and beverages along with leading several games will be done by LEO's.

LEO's are also part of Constitution Day, handing out Constitution booklets to fifth graders and playing a quiz game to see how much they know about the Constitution.

On Arbor Day LEO's hand out seedlings to fourth graders and demonstrate how to plant and care for their seedlings.

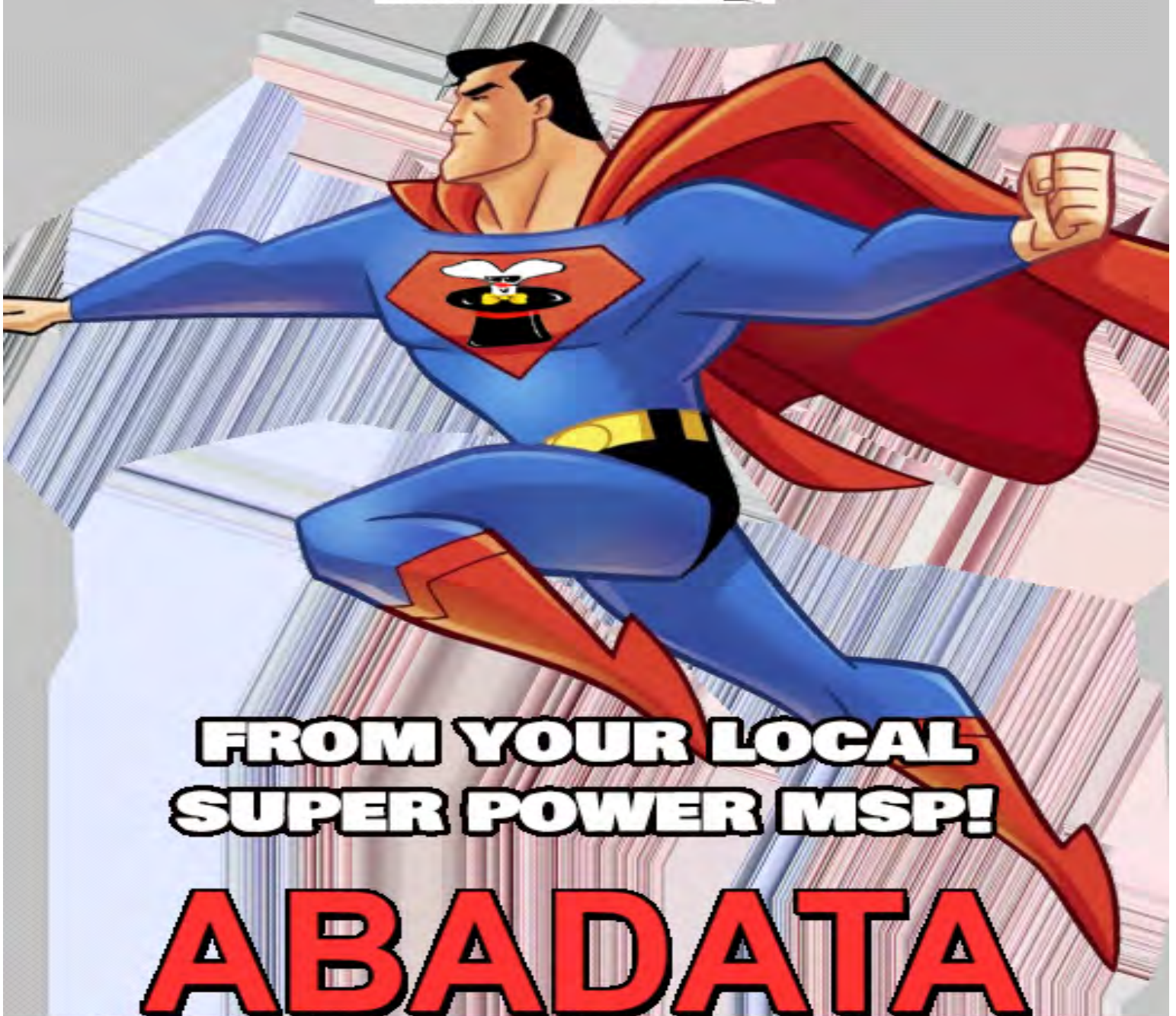

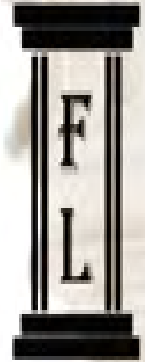
